

Effective Friday, April 24th at 8:00 AM, Pine Valley Golf Course will open per Wisconsin Gov. Evers Safer at Home order. This new order goes into effect on April 24th and expires on May 26th. Please follow the below guidelines that PVGC, in accordance with the Safer at Home Order, have complied to ensure Social Distancing Rules are met and to prevent gatherings or clustering of people.

Golf Course Guidelines

- Pine Valley Golf Course will open on Friday, April 24th, at 8:00 AM
- **Tee times are mandatory and must be made over the phone! Payment must be made when the tee time is reserved (Section 4.c.i.3), no walkups**
- One credit card transaction per reservation. For example, if your tee time is for 4 golfers, we are requesting that the person reserving the tee time pays for the entire group
- Call the Pro Shop to check-in upon arrival
- Please do not arrive more than 10 minutes before your tee time
- For non-season pass holders, tee times cannot be made more than 3 days in advance
- Greens fees are non-refundable, if you cannot play due to the weather, a rain check will be issued and will remain in the Pro Shop until redeemed
- No riding carts, no exceptions (Section 4.c.i.1)
- Reservations will be for either 9 hole or 18 hole rounds, no twilight golf during this time
- Pace of play expectations for 9 holes is 2 hours and 15 minutes and 18 holes is 4 hours and 30 minutes.
- Must start on designated 1st tee box
- Tee times will be spaced 12 minutes apart (Section 4.c.i.5)
- Clubhouse and pro shop must remain closed (Section 4.c.i.4)
- Driving range will be closed (Section 4.c.i.7)
- Online bookings will be available in May, we will let you know when that is available

Golf Course Setup and Preparation:

- Golf course will not have tee markers, bunker rakes, ball washers, garbage containers, or benches
- Scorecards and pencils will not be available (an electronic scorecard will be available in May)
- Holes on the course will have PVC piping in the cup so the golf ball does not fall to the bottom of the cup
- Please do not touch the flagstick or the cup
- Bathroom facilities will not be available

Food & Beverage:

- In accordance with the safer at home order (Section 13.d. and Section 13.e.), food and beverage sales are not permitted for consumption on the premises
- The state of Wisconsin prohibits individuals from bringing alcoholic beverages for consumption onto a golf course
- This will be strictly enforced and failure to comply could result in the loss of your golfing privileges

In order to keep the Golf Course open, we must all abide by the Social Distancing Rules and Regulations. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

We want to provide you with a safe environment, in which you can enjoy golf!

Restrictions per Safer at Home Order (Effective April 24th until May 26th)

Section 4.c.i.:

1. The use of golf carts is prohibited
2. Social Distancing Requirements must be observed at all times, unless the players reside in the same living unit or household
3. All tee times and payments must be made in advance online or by phone
4. Clubhouses and pro shops must remain closed. Any restaurant or bar facility may remain open and must comply with all restrictions in Section 13.d. and 13.e. of the Order
5. Tee times must be spaced to avoid multiple foursomes from clustering or gathering at any stage of the course
6. All maintenance work and groundskeepers shall comply with Section 2.b.i. and 2.b.ii. of the Order. All other functions may continue under Minimum Basic Operations
7. Driving ranges and miniature golf must remain closed

Section 13.d. Restaurants:

- Restaurants may remain open for food take-out or delivery service only
- ***Food and drink may not be consumed on premises, either indoors or outdoors***

Section 13.e. Bars:

- Carryout sales of alcohol beverages and food are allowed, if permitted by state law and municipal ordinance
- ***Food and drink may not be consumed on premises, either indoors or outdoors***
